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1. A petition has been filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, signed by more than twenty percentum (20%) of the qualified electors of said Town and taxpayers upon property within said Town and whose names appear on the last completed assessment roll for state and county taxes as taxpayers upon property within the Town, asking that an election be held, and that at such election the question be submitted to the qualified registered electors and taxpayers upon property within said Town, whether said Town shall issue its general obligation bonds in the sum of \$41,300.00 for the purpose of replacement of inadequate existing sewage treatment works with sewage lagoon type of sewage treatment consisting of sewage lift station, outfall, primary sewage lagoon and secondary sewage lagoon; and the Town Clerk, within fifteen (15) days after filing of said petition, having carefully examined the same and the County records showing the qualifications of the petitioners, has attached thereto a certificate under his official signature establishing that there are 262 persons who are registered electors of the Town and whose names appear upon the last completed assessment roll for state and county taxes, as taxpayers in the Town, that of the persons whose names are subscribed in said petition, 81 are possessed of all of the qualifications required by signers of such petition, and that such qualified signers constitute more than twenty percentum (20%) of the registered electors whose names appear upon the last completed assessment roll for state and county taxes, as taxpayers within said Town; and said petition also has attached thereto the affidavits of the persons who circulated the same, stating that the signatures thereon are genuine, and that the signers knew the contents thereof before signing the same.

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2. This Council having examined said petition and made all such other investigation as is deemed necessary, and being fully advised in the premises, does hereby find and determine that said petition is in proper form, bears the requisite number of signatures of qualified petitioners, and is in all other respects sufficient as set forth in the certificate of the Town Clerk.

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3. The exact amount of general obligation bonds to be issued for said purpose is hereby fixed at \$41,300.00 and said bonds shall be redeemable at the option of the Town ten (10) years from the date of issuance and on any interest payment date thereafter, and the maximum rate of interest which said bonds shall bear shall be six per centum (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually.

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4. The question of issuing said bonds as set forth in said petition shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the Town at an election which shall be called by further resolution of the Council.

27 2. At said election all, but only, the duly registered and
28 qualified electors of the Town of Culbertson, whose names appear upon
29 the last preceding assessment roll of Roosevelt County for state and
30 county taxes, as taxpayers upon property within the Town, shall be en-
31 titled to vote. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give
32 notice forthwith to the County Clerk of Roosevelt County of the call of
33 said election. Said County Clerk shall, after due notice of the closing
34 of the registration books has been given, prepare lists of all the quali-
35 fied electors and taxpayers entitled to vote at said election, and shall

37 in the form and manner prescribed by law.

43 Montana; and by also causing notice thereof to be posted in at least three
44 of the most public places in the voting precinct of the Town, not less
45 than ten (10) days prior to the date of said election, which notice so
46 published and posted shall read substantially as follows:

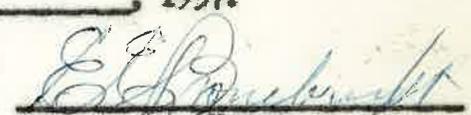

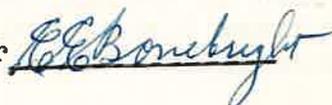
