On May 5, 1983, the Town of Culbertson (Applicant) filed an application with the Montana Public Service Commission for an order authorizing the Applicant to increase its sewer rates to provide revenues to defray increased costs of operation and to maintain and repair existing systems.

Having considered the application and the documentation furnished by Applicant in support of its application and deeming itself fully advised in the premises, the Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. A Notice Of Opportunity For Public Hearing to be held, if requested, was published in the June 12, 1983 edition of the Billings Gazette and the June 16, 1983 edition of the Culbertson Searchlight. The notice stated that if no requests for a public hearing were received by July 12, 1983 an appropriate order may be issued based upon evidence submitted with the application.
- 2. No protests or requests for public hearing were received and no hearing was scheduled.
- 3. On May 2, 1983 the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson passed Resolution No. 206 setting sewer rates at the proposed

level.

- 4. The Town alleges it needs additional revenue to provide for increased costs of operation and to repair the existing system.
- 5. The Town anticipates that the proposed rates will increase annual revenues by approximately \$11,500.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over parties and proceedings in this matter.
 - 2. The resulting rate levels are reasonable and just.

ORDER

- 1. The rates as set forth in Appendix "A" attached and by this reference incorporated herein are authorized.
- 2. These rates shall be effective for all sewer services rendered on and after July 25, 1983.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 217

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR A GRANT FROM THE WATER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION

WHEREAS, the Town of Culbertson has received approval from the 1983 Legislature for a \$100,000 grant and a \$100,000 loan from the Water Development Program of the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation to partially finance a \$1.3 million water intake and treatment system for the town;

WHEREAS, the Town of Culbertson has received approval of the 1983 legislature for a \$704,000 loan for the project financed with the proceeds of coal severance tax bonds;

Whereas, the Town of Culbertson was awarded a Department of Commerce CDBG grant of \$400,000 for the project;

WHEREAS, the administrative rules for the Water Development Program require that projects for which loans or grants are made be financially feasible; financial feasibility being if sufficient funds can be made available to complete the project;

WHEREAS, the constitutionality of the coal tax severance bonds is currently under consideration by the Montana Supreme Court;

WHEREAS, the Town of Culbertson will forfeit their grant from the Montana Department of Commerce CDBG program unless these funds are used by December, 1984:

WHEREAS, the Town of Culbertson desires to enter into an agreement with the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation for the grant portion of their approved financing package to complete final design plans and specifications in early 1984 so as not to forfeit any of their approved financing.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Culbertson agrees to the following conditions for incorporation into a grant agreement with the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation;

That other financing be pursued to the full extent of the Town's financing capability should the coal severance tax bond authority be determined to be unconstitutional,

That the grant to finance the final plans and specifications be converted to a loan should the project be unable to be substantially completed by the end of 1985 construction season,

That a mechanism be developed to amortize the loan within a period not to exceed 30 years should the grant be so converted.
