P.J. Anderson & Sons purchased the plant in 1967 mainly to expand the mustard business.

Continental Grain purchased the plant in 1976. From 1976 to 1979, contracted acres of safflower went from 60,000 to a high of 250,000. From 1979 to 1985 contracted acres of safflower went from 250,000 to 20,000 or less.

1985 Elders bought the plant with Canola in mind.

1990 SVO purchased the plant with olaic sunflowers in mind.

Which brings up to this date when the plant is once again for sale or due to be scrapped.

At the time of closing, SVO employeed 28 people - 13 Culbertosn residents, 11 rural Culbertson, 1 Froid, 1 Fairview, 1 Medicine Lake and 1 Poplar.

Council is considering being one of 4 investors in purchasing SVO. Jerry Knick is asking for a letter of intent for \$50,000. investment based on results of financial meeting. The projections for 5 years by month will be shown at the financial meeting along with profit sharing (24%, 24%, 24%, 28%). One council member or the mayor will sit on the board of directors. Bank would have first lein.

Council feels this would be a good investment in the future of our community.

Council will vote on letter of intent at the regular meeting on February 3, 1997.

February 12, 1997. The Culbertson Town Council met in special session with Jerry Knick at his request, on Wednesday, February 12, 1997 at 7:00 p.m. in the town hall. Jerry Knick began with an explanation of his efforts to develop a group to buy the Safflower Plant. Jerry's efforts began in Oct. - Nov. 1996. An application for Community Development Block Grant funds for \$500,000 low interest loan was done and a 95% assurance of that loan.

Dr. Bergman felt a growers group should buy the plant.

Jerry explained the various meetings he had with local and area people.

On January 27, 1997 Knick received an acceptance from SVO for purchase of the plant at \$400,000 - \$100,000 down, SVO finance balance at 8% interest and SVO took 2nd position on mortgage. First Community Bank of Culbertson approved loans of \$500,000 - \$700,000. Roosevelt County Commissioners offered some tax break. As of January 27, 1997 the investors were Town of Culbertson, Nemont Telephone Co-Op, Sheridan Electric Co-Op and Jerry Knick.

Jerry had made contacts with the meal and oil buyers. Projections for acres seeded at the 5th year was 700,000 acres. An application for license for Montola 2000 and 2001 was sent to R.D.I. at University in Bozeman. Montola planting seed - 5c/lb. would be added to the cost of planting seed sold to the farmer to cover a $1\frac{1}{2}c/lb$. royalty and $3\frac{1}{2}c/lb$. for safflower research. There would have been 8,000 acres of seed to start and 4,000,000 lbs. of seed needed in the future. Non-confirmed information was the license was to go to a growers organization only. There is not a safflower growers organization in the United States. Knick's opinion is if you can contract all the acres you want, a growers organization is not needed.

On Monday, February 10, 1997 at 3:30 p.m. Sheridan Electric notified Jerry Knick that they have bought the Safflower Plant. Jerry Knick has not made up his mind on hindering sale of the Safflower Plant to Sheridan Electric.

Knick's opinion is there is not enough olaic seed available for spring planting to allow for crushing in the fall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

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February 14, 1997 Special Meeting. The Culbertson Town Council met in special session on Friday morning, Feb. 14, 1997 at 8:30 a.m. The following were present: Reginal Rudolph, Bernie W. Reginal Rudolph made a motion to approve March 3, 1997 minutes and Feb. 28, 1997 Treasurer Report. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Clerk was asked to talk to Doug McCormick at First Community Bank about current interest rates and town's current investments.

<u>Audit Exit</u>. Doris Leader, CHMS, P.C., discussed audit findings from FY ending 6-30-95 and 6-30-96. The town has not maintained adequate fixed asset records in the General Fixed Asset Account Group and has not maintained adequate fixed asset records in the Enterprise Funds and depreciation of Enterprise Fund Assets. Other reportable conditions noted in the schedule of findings: 1.) Segregation of Duties, 2.) Montana Safety Culture Act, 3.) Fixed Assets, 4.) Salaries, 5.) Employee vs Independent Contractor, and 6.) Vacation and Sick Leave Accrual.

<u>9-1-1</u>. Sheriff Grainger said the council needs to appoint a representative from Culbertson to serve on the 9-1-1 Committee. Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to appoint Carol Lyseng as the 9-1-1 representative from Culbertson. Edward Anklam seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Gordon Oelkers made a motion to approve the Final State 9-1-1 Plan. Reginal Rudolph seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. This plan is establishing the 9-1-1 telephone system and the use of the State 9-1-1 money.

Wednesday, Sheriff Grainger will pick-up the plan signed by Mayor Baldwin and Fire Chief Alan Aspenlieder.

<u>Pasture Rent</u>. Gene Schmitz said he would like to rent the 17 acres west of the lagoons. Gene will be responsible for any fence repairs necessary. Gordon Oelkers made a motion to go 3 years at \$170./yr. to lease the 17 acres to Gene Schmitz. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. Clerk will type up the lease.

Water Outside Town Limits. Jerry Lyseng wants to be on town water supply system. Lyseng's would have to pay all installation costs, \$850.00 new connection fee, \$50.00 deposit and \$25.00 turn-on fee. Jerry Lyseng is working with Bob Jasper on the project. The water service line would be l_2^{1} " and it is 850' to the main. Also, Lyseng's will get an easement from Donald Oelkers. Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to grant permission for Jerry Lyseng to tap the town water supply. Reginal Rudolph seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. April 7, 1997 cont.

125,000 Gal. Water Tank. Gordon Oelkers made a motion to authorize Mayor Baldwin to sign the 3 copies of the Bid Form awarding bid for site work to L. Scanlan for \$74053.04 and authorize Mayor baldwin to sign the Form of Agreement Between Owner and Contractor when town received it with L. Scanlan's signature and all the necessary Performance and Payment Bonds. Edward Anklam seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. Town received contract from Sheridan Sheet Metal and Electric for moving the tank. Mayor Baldwin signed the contract.

<u>Pool Park Trees</u>. Steve had an estimate of \$350.00 from Ron Larsen, Larsen Construction for cutting down 2 trees by the swimming pool. Ron would cut them down, town haul them out. Council said go ahead.

Finnicum, Edward Anklam, Gordon Oelkers, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Steve Moore and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Guests: Keenan Engelke, Butch Cooper and Nancy with Diamond Construction, Ron Arthur, Ken Forbregd, Steve Baldwin, Lynn and Linda Labatte.

Reginal Rudolph made a motion to approve April 7, 1997 minutes and accept March 31, 1997 Treasurer Report. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Scale/Rest Area</u>. Butch Cooper, Diamond Construction, discussed the proposed changes for the Sanitary Sewer installation to the scale/rest area. The original location of the lift station was partly in the boulevard and partly in what would be the street. Also, the ground at the depth requirement of the lift station, was unstable. Council did not oppose the proposed changes.

<u>Curb Stop Repair</u>. Steve Baldwin said the curb stop on his property is leaking and needs to be dug up and repaired. He wanted to know when Steve Moore could schedule this. He would like this done before fall. Steve Moore said he has a list of 5 curb stops to do.

<u>Garbage Lawsuit</u>. Attorney Greg Hennessy reported on the Montana Supreme Court ruling on <u>L & L</u> Sanitation v. Town of <u>Culbertson</u> last week, and two letters received from L & L since then. The ruling held that the Town's 1967 garbage ordinance had enough wiggle-room to allow L & L to compete can by can with the Town's contract hauler for each residence and business in town. L & L had previously held a monopoly on the entire town, but lost it in a competitive bidding process in 1995 by more than the 5% Montana resident bidder preference, or about \$11000 difference. After a seven month absence in town, L & L has

sought to regain the business it lost in the open competition, despite the fact that the town's size cannot support two garbage haulers financially. Other discussion was the fact that the town is obligated to pay the current garbage contractor the contract amount whether any residents subscribe to L & L's new service. L & L has threatened further litigation if the Town tightens up its ordinance, even though the Council in bidding the last contract had performed its duty to get the entire Town the most garbage service for the least money, as in prior Councils.

Clerk did First Reading of Ordinance No. 185. An Ordinance Amending Town Code Chapter 7.02 Garbage Collection Service And Fees And To Make Them Both Exclusive Within The Town Limits. Gordon Oelkers moved passage of Ordinance No. 185. Reginal Rudolph seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. Second Reading of Ordinance No. 185 will be June 2, 1997 to be effective in early July.

<u>All-School Reunion</u>. Allen Peterson left papers for the Council to sign so the fireworks for the All-School Reunion could be purchased through a government entity. The forms were: 1.) Permit To Buy Fireworks For Display or Entertainment Purposes and 2.) Letter of Authorization. The forms were from Rich Brothers Interstate Display Fireworks Company.

Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to approve 5-5-97 minutes and accept 4-30-97 Treasurer Report. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Bernie W. Finnicum, Gordon Oelkers and Edward Anklam. Absent and not voting: Reginal Rudolph. MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Baldwin welcomed Keenan Engelke and asked him if he had something he wanted to discuss with the council. Keenan said he was just observing and thanked Mayor Baldwin for the acknowledgment.

Garbage. Clerk did Second Reading of Ordinance No. 185. An Ordinance Amending Town Code Chapter 7.02 Garbage Collection Service And Fees And To Make Them Both Exclusive Within The Town Limits. Gordon Oelkers moved passage of Ordinance No. 185. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Gordon Oelkers, Bernie W. Finnicum and Edward Anklam. Council reviewed letters from Attorney Laura Christoffersen dated May 1, 2 and 23, 1997 on behalf of L & L Sanitation. In part, the May 23, 1997 letter states: "Frankly, we believe that we can prove losses for the past two years equivalent to the value of the prior contract that we had with the Town and we further believe that we can prove losses into the future at least five years equivalent to the value of the present contract you have given to Dave's Sanitation. Clearly this claim would exceed \$350,000. Additionally pursuant to the statute we would be entitled to the value of our equipment. Given these factors, we would be willing to settle our claim presently for a lump sum payment of \$250,000."

Attorney Hennessy answered Christoffersen's May 2, 1997 letter point by point. However, Attorney Christoffersen's letter dated 5-23-97 did not answer or rebut any of Attorney Hennessy's response. Attorney Hennessy said the arithmetic for the \$250,000 and \$350,000 is not included nor is the fair market value of L & L Sanitation's equipment. But prior to the fair market value of the equipment

being determined, the question of buy or delay clause has to be determined. The question of lost profits - you have to be able to prove with certainty lost profits.

July 7, 1997. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Reginal Rudolph, Bernie W. Finnicum, Edward Anklam, Gordon Oelkers, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, Steve Moore and Raedelle Aspenlieder. Guests: Don Loomer, John Grainger, Carol Lyseng and Keenan Engelke.

Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to approve 6-2-97 minutes and accept 5-31-97 Treasurer Report. Edward Anklam seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>911.</u> Carol Lyseng and Sheriff Grainger brought the council up-to-date on the 911 plan. July 17 will be an important meeting on 911. It seems the County and the Tribe are not in agreement on the employment issue.

Clerk will research town ordinances for non-licensed drivers on motorcycles or snowmobiles taking the quickest means out-of-town.

Sheriff Car. Town owns the sheriff car used for the contract. The county outfits the car with radio, radar, etc. Town will sell or trade the old car when a new one is purchased. Clerk will find out what dollar limit requires town to go out on bid to purchase vehicles.

125,000 Gal. Tank. The 125,000 gal. water tank is welded back together. Sheridan Sheet Metal has some grinding to do yet. Scanlan will be backfilling this week. Basin Sandblasting will sandblast, prime and paint the tank. Scanlan cut all the control wires to the plant and charts. They will have an electrician here this week to do the repairs. In the mean time, Steve has to climb the tank for readings.

Steve reported the water treatment plant roof leaks.

Council discussed the problem of people putting their boats in at our water intake. They run over the hoses and move the pump and lines. Gordon Oelkers made a motion to put up a sign "No Trespassing - City Property - Authorized Personnel Only". Reginal Rudolph seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Steve discussed the condition of the walkway to the floating pump, it isn't safe and needs to be fixed. The walkway is not stable and the pontoons are aged.

Hour meters for the river and lift station motors have been ordered from Red's Electric. Good records will help with maintenance of the motors.

Lagoons. Steve discussed the possibility of running sheep in the lagoon area for weed and cattail control. The State gave approval for this. Rolland Raaum is willing to pasture some sheep in the lagoon area. Attorney Hennessy will draw up an agreement.

Library. Ellerkamp Construction finished the stucco job on the bottom portion of the library. Larsen Const. will do the down spout.

Council asked Steve to send M.D.U. a bill for street repair by Muriel Park.

Mosquitos. The new mosquito mister is a little noisy, but seems to be working well. A new battery was purchased for the mister.

<u>Pool</u>. Clerk will bill Mark Leinen for a gallon of paint and labor to paint (3 kids for 1 hr.) to paint the pool pumphouse. The young Leinen girl had spray painted the pumphouse last fall.

Clerk is to send Michael Nordmeyer a registered letter and bill for the guard rail he hit 1-1-97. If he does not pay, it will be turned over to small claims court.

Waterline Replacement. Steve said they will be starting on waterline replacement from the Post Office south to Highway #16 (1st Ave. E.). Jim told Steve to be sure and use the coffer boxes in the hole.

<u>Curb Stops</u>. Dave Schledewitz and Robert Gustafson curb stops need to be fixed and both are in the sidewalk. Clerk is to send Dave Schledewitz a copy of the ordinance and let him know we will be fixing the curb stop and he will be receiving a bill.

125,000 Gallon Tank. Don Loomer said Scanlan is getting an electrician lined up to repair lines he cut. Don talked about having the tank magnafluxed to check for leaks. Clerk called Jerry Knick, Sheridan Sheet Metal, and put him on the speakerphone to discuss having the tank magnafluxed or some other method of checking the tank for leaks. The contract with Sheridan Sheet Metal was to get the tank here and back together so it doesn't leak. After alot of discussion, Don Loomer suggested Jerry talk to Ron Gerwin, Basin Sandblasting and Scanlan about the complications of filling the tank and testing for leaks. Ron's deadline from Scanlan is 7-15-97. Tank should be full so as it has the pressure on the weld.

Council discussed with Don Loomer the possibility of putting a concrete wall inside the 1,000,000 gal. tank. Don has been doing a little research on this and he still needs more information about the present foundation of the tank. Estimated cost to do this is from \$100,000 to \$150,000.

<u>Alleys</u>. Allen Pedersen wants the okay to dig the alley down some behind his house. The alley is high and drops to Vickie Snedigar's. This is okay by the council.

<u>New Scale and Rest Area</u>. Mayor Baldwin explained that the new weigh scale being built east of town had a grease seperator in the original plans. However, the State approved a revised plan with no seperator in the pit. The drain goes directly into the city sewer system. Council did not have a problem with revised plan of no seperator as long as State Environmental Quality approved.

Budget Meetings. Budget meeting for FY 1997-98 are July 14 and 21. Public hearing will be held 7-28-97. All budget meetings start at 7:00 p.m.

<u>No Primary Election</u>. Gordon Oelkers made a motion for Resolution No. 285. WHEREAS, the Election Administrator determined that a primary election need not be held. Reginal Rudolph seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Jensen said the gallons used were wasted and wanted to know if the town would adjust for this. Council said we had to bill according to the meter reading and gallons gone through the meter.

<u>MT Dept. of Transportation</u>. Culbertson requested 2 traffic studies. Before a study can be done, an informational meeting must be held. The purpose of this meeting is to explain the speed zoning methodology when establishing a realistic speed zone. They would like to meet with the local governing agency. Clerk will inform everyone of the date and time of this meeting.

<u>Building Permits</u>. Building permits for Gordon Miller, Miller Oil Co., Steve Anders and Dennis Elgen were approved.

Lifeguards. Lifeguards have to be re-certified every 3 years. Jenell Marchwick Bear was a certified instructor, so she could re-certify lifeguards. Jenell has moved and no one in Culbertson can do this. Mary Fusaro and Andrea Vannatta recently were re-certified and it cost them each \$100.00. Mary and Andrea were

concerned about this expense and the fact that there will be other lifeguards that need to re-certify next year. They wondered if the council would consider helping lifeguards out with this expense. Finnicum. Attorney Hennessy swore in Jack C. Scotson as councilman to finish the term of Reginal Rudolph who resigned. Guests: Rich & Patti Walker, Muriel Park, Keenan Engelke and Robert Jasper.

Gordon Oelkers made a motion to approve August 4, 1997 minutes and accept July 31, 1997 Treasurer Report. Edward Anklam seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Gordon Oelkers, Edward Anklam and Jack Scotson. Absent and not voting: Bernie W. Finnicum. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Streets</u>. Muriel Park is concerned about water run-off and getting water in her basement. The crown that was built up in the street did seem to help when we got that $l\frac{1}{2}$ " rain, but Muriel said if we would have gotton another $\frac{1}{2}$ " she would of had water in the basement. Mayor Baldwin said the town was planning to put another lift on the crown when 1st Ave. E. was being patched.

Propane System - Miller Oil Co. - M.D.U.

Mat Golik - MDU - explained that the entity that buys the propane system is regulated by the Montana Public Service Commission. The entity must follow PSC regulations on testing, rates and safety operations. According to the PSC, a public hearing would delay the sale of the system from M.D.U. to Miller Oil Co. As of the morning of Monday, 11-3-97 there were no protests received by the PSC. An informational meeting request would not constitute a Public Hearing by the PSC, and a protest/or protests would have to be significant in order for the PSC to hold a public hearing.

The council has no intention of requesting a hearing from the PSC that would delay the sale.

Gordon Miller said he plans to operate the system the same as M.D.U. has been operating, there would be no changes. The council has reviewed the transfer of ownership, there is no problem as far as the town goes.

Kathy Kilsdonk wants no truck traffic on 3rd Ave. E. Council didn't see how they could restrict truck traffic. Kathy asked if we could at least slow the traffic down some as there are kids living in the area. Gordon Oelkers made a motion to post 25 mile speed limit signs on each end of 3rd Ave. E. Edward Anklam seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Garbage Truck</u>. Jim had the scale figure the amount of payload the garbage trucks they have looked at can haul. The truck in Dickensen – can haul $8\frac{1}{2}$ ton payload and they offer a lease agreement with first year due at the end of the first year.

The truck in Buffalo, WY - can haul 7 ton payload.

Council decided to hold off on a truck for a few more weeks. Clerk is to call Billings Truck Center and let them know we don't want a big heavy truck. We need to be able to haul an 8 ton payload.

<u>Sidney Landfill</u>. Council received a letter from Board of Richland County Solid Waste District - Russell Huotari, Secretary. Disposal fee for municipal waste is \$26.00 per ton. If acceptable, they would encourage a two-year contract, commencing disposal of garbage at our convenience. Council is not interested in a 2 year contract. Jim will call Russ Huotari back on this as we would like to keep our options open.

Director of Public Works. Council decided to review Director of Public Works applications on Tuesday, 11-4-97 and interview applicants on Wednesday, 11-5-97.

Keenan Engelke offered to let the town use his roto hammer drill.

<u>Cemetery</u>. Laurie Mattelin called on 10-21-97 and wanted to know if the council would be in favor of a "group" - 1 council member, 1 women's club member and 1 cemetery assoc. member - for 1 meeting per year - for "Tree Maintenance for Cemetery". Council said this was a good idea. She can choose a council member. Landfill. The landfill ordinance needs to be reviewed and may need to be updated. Clerk will pull the ordinance and council will review at the next regular meeting.

<u>Street Lighting</u>. There are 2 street lights on the boulevard where the old scale house used to be - these were scheduled to be removed. If the school district agrees to leave them and the town council agrees to add these 2 lights to the street lighting utility costs - a letter from each party to M.D.U. is required. Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to add the 2 street lights where the old scale used to be to the street lighting utility costs. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. Clerk

will send a letter to M.D.U.

Rick Kessner stopped in the office and suggested there be stop or yield signs on 4th Ave. W. & 3rd St. Also suggested should have yield signs to go to 1st St. W. Council was not in favor of more stop signs, and there are yield signs to go to 1st St. W. except when they dead end.

Garbage Suit. Council reviewed Mr. Savage writing, received by Attorney Hennessy, to General Counsel for MMIA.

Building Permit. Building permit for McKinney Motor was approved and signed.

Gordon Oelkers made a motion to adopt Resolution Number 290. A Resolution setting the All-Purpose levy of 85.97 mills and Library 4.98 mills for a total of 90.95 mills for fiscal year ending June 30, 1998. Jack Scotson seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Clerk informed council of "Application for Transfer of Ownership of Montana Off-Premise Consumption Beer/Wine License No. 17-999-6801-303, Val-Am Stop-N-Shop.

Clerk questioned garbage rate for new scale/rest area. Should the garbage charge be the same rate as the old scale \$12.00? Council said to hold off on a rate change for now as rest area is not open yet.

125,000 Gal Tank. The water sample from the 125,000 gal. tank was okay.

GJV. General journal voucher #202 was approved and signed.

<u>Airport</u>. Gordon Oelkers made a motion to approve and sign the County/City Airport Agreement. This Agreement is between the City of Culbertson and the County of Roosevelt. Normally incurred operating expenses, ie insurance, utilities, snow removal, shall be shared equally by the city and the county. The term of this agreement shall be for one year, fiscal year 1997/98, and renewable for a like term by mutual consent of both parties. Edward Anklam seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. Gordon Oelkers made a motion to approve and sign the Airport Lease. This Agreement is between Roosevelt County Airport Board, a municipal corporation, the party of the first part, the Town of Culbertson, a municipal corporation, party of the second part, and Steve Hampton, d/b/a Modern Aire Flight Service, the party of the third part. Edward Anklam seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Tree Trimming</u>. The trees that need to be trimmed by the alley and street of properties in town is a long long list. Clerk will work on the list and ready a letter to be sent out this spring. Also a notice/plea to property owners will be put in the Searchlight.

<u>School Signs</u>. Town received a letter from MT Dept. of Transportation about School Signing U.S. 2. The Traffic Section recommended to the District that two "School" warning signs be installed as a temporary measure east and west 750 feet in advance of the school grounds adjoining US 2; pending the completion of a speed zone study. Council agreed this is acceptable as a temporary measure, but do want the traffic study done.

Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion to approve Nov. 3, 1997 minutes and accept 10-31-97 Treasurer Report. Jack Scotson seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Oil Lease. Mr. K.A.C. MacNair with Montana Oil Properties is in the process of re-entering some of the old oil wells - one is the Moore well. They think they can get a minimum of 400 barrels/day. Montana Oil Properties are offering \$30./acre and $12\frac{1}{2}$ % royalty for a 3 year lease. The town has 22.6 acres. Dick Haug, Oil Lease Broker, is offering 60./acre and $13\frac{1}{2}\%$ royalty for a 3 year lease. Gordon Oelkers made a motion to accept the lease offer from Montana Oil Properties for \$30./acre for 3 years. Motion died for lack of a second. Mr. MacNair left for a few minutes to call the Billings office about the possibility of offering a match to the \$60./acre. Bernie W. Finnicum made a motion that if Montana Oil Properties make the offer of \$60./acre between now and the Jan. 5, 1998 council meeting, the town accept and sign the 3 year lease. Gordon Oelkers seconded the motion. Those voting in favor of the motion: Bernie W. Finnicum, Gordon Oelkers and Edward Anklam. Opposed: Jack Scotson. MOTION CARRIED.

Action for Eastern Montana. Council discussed the possibility of having a student work for the town under the Action for Eastern Montana program during the summer. Clerk will check into this with the Glendive office.

Keenan Engelke thanked Jim for being our Mayor. Jim thanked Keenan for his support.

Landfill. The landfill is now open every 2nd Monday from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. thru March. Town employees will fill in for Tom Marchwick as needed.

Diamond Coulee Tr. Ct. Diamond Coulee Trailer Court was charged for 1 household unit last month. The water is on. Rich Walker stopped by the office to complain, as he has not had anyone in the court for over a month. If he wants the water shut-off at the curb the only charge would be \$15.40 construction fee.

<u>Missouri River</u>. Council received information from Citizens for Missouri River Green Belt for the designation of the Missouri as an American Heritage River.
